Course description

Content

The ability to manage information and knowledge has increasingly become important both for individuals and organisations. An integral part of any decision-making process is the determination of the value of information extracted from the data. Knowledge is considered a valuable commodity, embedded in products and in the tacit knowledge of highly mobile individual employees. Information and knowledge management represent a deliberate and systematic approach to cultivating and sharing an organisation's knowledge base.

The textbook and professional reference used in this course offer a comprehensive overview of the field. Drawing on ideas, tools, and techniques from such disciplines as sociology, cognitive science, organisational behaviour, and information science, it describes KM theory and practice at the organisational levels.

Learning objectives

Learning outcomes

The aim of this course is to give an overview of different theoretical and practical premises of information and knowledge management. In particular, an emphasis is paid into information and knowledge management (IKM) from organisational perspective. This course provides an overview of the epistemology of information and knowledge, their practical implications in the organisational context and how to develop and create knowledge from information by making use of different methods and models of knowledge creation and management. The importance of individuals and organisations' role in knowledge capturing, creation, sharing, disseminating, use and reusing will be highlighted.

During this course students gain new skills as to how deal with massive amount of data and how data can be transferred into information and knowledge. Such knowledge equips students with the ability to transfer their knowledge in their work practices.


During the course students are expected to learn:

- —apply information and KM theories and research into an actual organisation

- —KM tools and KM assessment






